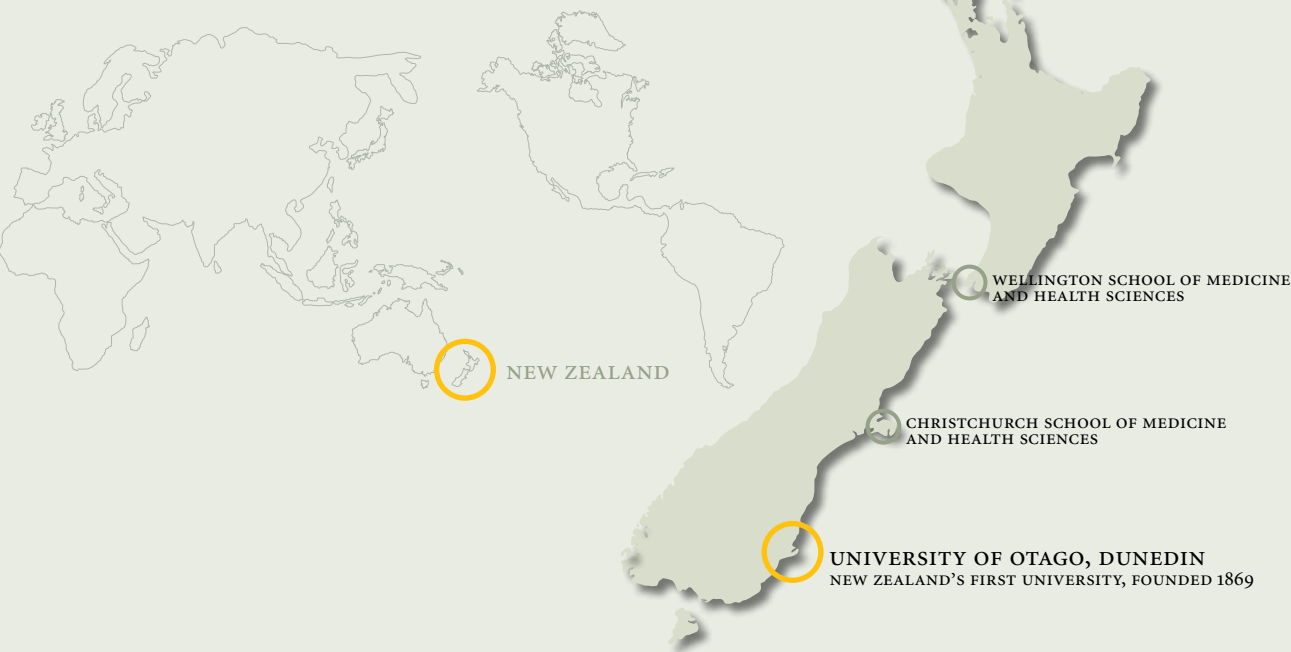

WHY STUDY AT OTAGO?

The University of Otago is New Zealand's oldest university. Otago is also New Zealand's top-ranked university for research (PBRF Quality Evaluation 2006). Otago's outstanding academic reputation and strong research profile attract highly talented students from all over New Zealand and overseas. Otago has extensive research and student exchange linkages with leading universities in Asia, Europe and the Americas.

LOCATION AND SITES

The main campus is in Dunedin, a city of culture and learning in scenic southern New Zealand (population 121,000). The region provides excellent outdoor recreation and field-study opportunities. Students live in a mix of University and private accommodation within walking distance of academic and city facilities. This setting provides the vibrant campus lifestyle for which Otago is so famous. Otago attracts a high percentage of its student population from outside Dunedin (over 70% of its students come from outside Dunedin).

Otago is a university with a national presence with Schools of Medicine & Health Sciences in Christchurch and Wellington.

ACADEMIC YEAR

The University has two semesters and a Summer School.

The **First Semester** runs from late February to late June

The **Second Semester** runs from early July to mid November.

The **Summer School** takes place in early January to late February.

Most students commence degree study in the First Semester.

PATHWAYS TO DEGREE STUDY

University of Otago Language Centre

The University of Otago Language Centre offers English language preparation for the Foundation Year, undergraduate or postgraduate study, and for general communication. The Language Centre is a registered test centre for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS), the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), and the Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC). Students have access to most University services and facilities.

University of Otago Foundation Year

The University offers an eight-month preparatory programme for students who need further English and academic preparation before commencing bachelor's degree study. The Foundation Year is taught on the University campus and students can access most University services and facilities. The Foundation Year programme has intakes in February, June and October.

ACCOMMODATION

Almost all Otago students live within walking distance of the University campus and key facilities such as lecture theatres, libraries and computer resource rooms.

Most undergraduate students live in one of the twelve fully catered colleges of residence or in the self-catering Toroa College in their first year of study. In addition, Abbey College provides a catered residential facility for postgraduate students. All colleges have a residential warden to ensure the safety and well-being of residents. After the first year of study many students move into rented flats. Dunedin has a wide range of rental accommodation.

STUDENT SERVICES AND FACILITIES

Otago provides a comprehensive range of services and facilities including:

- Accommodation Office
- Careers Advisory Service
- Computer Resource Rooms
- International Office
- Specialist libraries plus a modern Central Library
- Recreation Services including a sports centre
- Student Health and Counselling Service
- Student Learning Centre

The International Office runs on-campus orientation programmes for new international students, operates the student mentor programme and Language Match, and offers a student visa renewal service and assistance with insurance. The Otago University Students' Association and numerous clubs and societies organise events and activities throughout the year.
